

**Do you want to become an equity-oriented, anti-racist middle or high school English teacher
and be paid in your final year?**

Here's how!



UD English Education (XEE) Teacher Residency 4-Year Coursework Plan



In the table below, the Group requirements (A, B, C, and D) are indicated in parentheses, and courses fulfilling English Education requirements are marked with (XEE). Some courses fulfill more than one requirement, and taking such courses is an important way to complete the XEE major with maximum flexibility in the fourth year/residency year, when students will be in their placement three days a week in the fall and full time from January to June. For example, while students can choose among many courses to fulfill their 3 Group B requirements, if they take AFRA110, ENGL278, and ENGL204 for Group B, they are fulfilling not only College of Arts and Sciences requirements but also XEE requirements. The schedule below illustrates one way to incorporate these courses wherever possible. Courses marked with an “d” at the end must be taken in the semester indicated; all others can be moved. In addition, note that this is a sample schedule that attempts to have the maximum requirements completed before the fourth year. Other configurations are possible, including taking another course or two in the fourth year if necessary. Please talk with your XEE faculty advisor to determine the best path for you.

^c In this sample course schedule, most semesters have heavy credit loads. Students can choose to follow this schedule or to take courses over summer and/or winter sessions instead. **Students must complete at least 124 credits to earn the BA degree.** The schedule as written here will give students 124 credits total.

^d These courses must be taken in the specified semester since they are part of the English Education methods sequence. All others can be moved around as needed.

^e We recommend that English Education majors choose Group C courses that are equity-oriented and anti-racist when available, such as AFRA205, AFRA215, ANTH/WOMS223, HDFS202, POSC220, SOCI213, UAPP225, or WOMS201.
